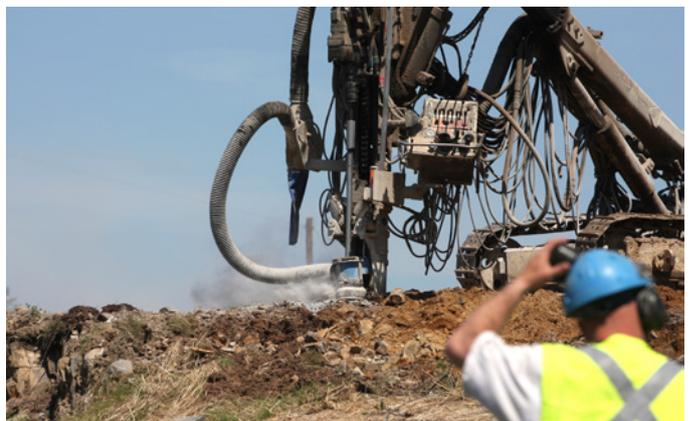


Focusing on what matters to prevent workplace noise-induced hearing loss

This guide will help you assess how well noise-related risks are managed in your business.

It contains questions to flush out what's going well and any gaps or blind-spots.

These questions are adapted from the Forum's *Monitoring What Matters* guide, which supports CEOs, directors and executives to maintain effective oversight of health and safety.

* Under the Health and Safety at Work Act, the steps that businesses must take to meet their legal requirements depend on how much influence and control they have over what has created the risk.
